A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

The healing of a leper narrated in the Gospel of this Sunday's Mass must have moved people very much, and it figured frequently in the preaching of the apostles. The fact that it is related in great detail by three of the Evangelists makes this clear. Saint Luke provides the detail that the miracle was performed in a town, and that the disease was in an advanced state. The leper was covered with it: a man full of leprosy, Luke says. At that time leprosy was an incurable condition. The limbs of the leper became gradually affected by the progressive illness, which would produce disfigurement to the face, hands and feet, and great suffering. For fear of contagion lepers were driven away from built-up areas and forbidden to use the highways.

As we hear in the First Reading of the Mass, they were pronounced legally unclean. They had to keep their heads uncovered and wear torn clothes to distinguish themselves, and were obliged to make their presence known when they passed close to any inhabited place. People fled from even members of their own families. Their affliction was generally held to be a punishment from God for their sins. Thus it is strange to find this leper inside a city. Perhaps he has heard of Jesus and has been eagerly looking for a chance to approach Him.

At last he has found him and breaks the strict precept of the old Mosaic Law in order to speak to Him. Christ is his hope, his only hope. It must have been an extraordinary scene. The leper knelt before Jesus. If you want to, he said, you can make me clean. If you want to ... Perhaps he had prepared a longer speech, explaining things ... but in the end this simple blurted-out aspiration, filled with trust, with sincere sensitivity, is enough: 'Si vis, potes me mundare', if you will, you can ... These few words, stammered out, are in a fact a powerful prayer.

Jesus took pity on him, and the three Evangelists describe the surprising gesture of Our Lord: He stretched out His hand and touched him. Until now, everyone had recoiled from him in dread and loathing, but Jesus, who could have healed from a distance as He had done on other occasions, not only did not draw away from him, but even touched his leprosy. It is not hard to imagine Christ's affection and the gratitude of the leper when he saw Our Lord's gesture and heard his words: I will; be clean.





2024 Lenten Regulations

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead, from Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024 until Holy Thursday morning, March 28, 2024, the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these 40 days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert — alone, fasting and in intense prayer — beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those 40 days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OF THE OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE. The Pastor of a Parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.
- 2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic ill nesses, such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.
- 3. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as noted above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.
- 4. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.
- 5. The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year often called "Easter duty" for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18, 2024 to Trinity Sunday, May 25-26, 2024. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to Confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church. We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

From the Trenton Monitor, February 2024:

Faithful of the Diocese and beyond are welcomed to spend part of their Lenten observance by going on a local pilgrimage in Mercer County. Once again, the Catholic parishes in Mercer County are adapting a centuries-old Roman tradition that traces its roots as far back as the late second and early third century by inviting others to visit their churches and celebrate evening Mass during Lent. It had been the practice that every year during Lent, Catholics living in Rome made an ancient pilgrimage to the basilicas and churches located throughout the city. A different "station church" was designated each day for Catholics from around the city to gather for Mass early in the morning as a visible reminder of the unity of the Church.

Looking ahead to the start of the 2024 pilgrimage, which is set to begin February 16, Msgr. Dennis Apoldite, sees it as an "opportunity for us to glean a bit of history as we make our way to the various churches throughout the county. As we move from church to church, we can imagine the thousands of people who have journeyed to these churches especially during the Lenten season to offer the prayer and worship. We can unite our prayers with theirs and join our voices with this great crowd of witnesses who over the past 200 years have found many ways to give glory to God, and public witness to their Catholic faith," said Msgr. Apoldite, who is pastor of Sacred Heart Parish and Episcopal Vicar of Mercer County. Msgr. Apoldite reflected on the Mercer County parishes that are participating in the 2024 pilgrimage, saying that each church has a special history and its own particular treasures. "Each has been the place of Baptisms, Confirmations, weddings, funerals and a place where countless numbers have encountered God," he said, noting that the churches are welcome to plan their evening as they wish. Extending an invitation to all prospective pilgrims, Msgr. Apoldite said, "Join in as many visits you are able and ask God's blessing upon on all who journey with you during this Lenten pilgrimage of 2024."

In the Traditional Catholic calendar, the Ember Days fall on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the first Sunday in Lent, after Pentecost Sunday, during the third full week of September, and after the third Sunday of Advent.

QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

READINGS: 1 Cor 13:1-13 Lk 18:31-43

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. No

Be Thou unto me a God, a Protector, and a place of refuge, to save me; Thou art my strength and my refuge: and for Thy Name's sake Thou wilt lead me, and nourish me. [Ps 30:2]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are in the "pre-Lent" period, roughly "fifty days" before Easter [Latin: *Quinquagesima*]. We now are earnestly preparing our way for Holy Lent. This week we return to the first letter of Paul to the Church at Corinth. As mentioned last week, Paul fraternally corrects the Corinthians, as they were very smug about their "spiritual excellence." Paul is chastising the Corinthians, for their attitudes regarding Christian living, so poor in the context of faith, hope, and [particularly] charity.

From the Gospel of Luke, we find the first of three predictions of the passion. Apparently, this prediction was so shocking to the disciples that they could neither contextualize scripture nor understand that Jesus was to be this "suffering servant." We, too, are being prepared for these events, once again – will WE get it? How does the Gospel of today hang with the epistle? There are a couple of things going on here. *Caritas super omnia* [charity above all] – Jesus predicts the highest form of ἀγάτιη [agape] love – total, sacrificial, unconditional love, even unto death. The scene shifts toward Jericho; the blind man hears the commotion, and he asks what is going on. The man, no doubt, has heard of the wonders that Jesus has performed; in faith and hope, he asks for pity [charity]. The man wishes to regain sight; Jesus rewards his faith. We have the thread of faith, hope, and charity throughout our readings of today – a 'type' of Our Lord cleaning up our imperfections and redeeming us. From our very souls, do we exclaim, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"? And how well do we see the face of the suffering Christ in our brothers and sisters?

The Carmelite knows that the world is full of folks who do not have a sense of their own wretchedness [including ourselves] – indeed, sinfulness of any type is wretched. Sin is adultery against the marriage of Christ and His Church. We pray for all God's children – that all humanity will have fidelity to the Bridegroom. We pray for the proper formation of conscience – that we act on it, and, if unsure, NOT to act [out of concern for not offending Our Lord]. We enter Holy Lent praying that the world would regain sorrow for sin – profound regret for it – a firm purpose of amendment.

To Jesus Christ be all glory!

"'Abyss calls to abyss.' It is there in the very depths that the divine impact takes place, where the abyss of our nothingness encounters the Abyss of mercy, the immensity of the all of God.

There we will find the strength to die to ourselves and, losing all vestige of self, we will be changed into love."




Joe Klecko
