A Note From Our Pastor



My Dear Parishioners,

Today the Easter season concludes with Pentecost Sunday, commemorating that day in the budding Church when the Father and the Son poured out the Holy Spirit in a special way on the Apostles and they took up the mission of proclaiming the Gospel throughout the whole world. The Holy Spirit throughout the Church's history has showered down gifts upon her to keep her faithful to the teaching she's received from Our Lord, and to keep the fires burning to inspire hearts to turn to Our Lord and be reconciled with God and with man.

In today's Gospel, we're reminded of one of the Spirit's greatest gifts, a gift Our Lord conferred to the Apostles on the eve of His Resurrection: the gift of reconciliation with God.

Our Lord first bestows the gift of reconciliation with His dearest friends, the friends who abandoned Him in His moment of need: "Peace be with you." It's no coincidence that He repeats this desire for reconciliation even as He is breathing the Holy Spirit upon them. It is the Holy Spirit who makes reconciliation possible. The Spirit raised Jesus from the dead and gave him new life so that reconciliation would be possible.

One of the most saddening ways to break off a relationship with someone is to say, "you are dead to me". In God's eyes, even in those situations, the Spirit can make that person come alive again through the grace of mercy, whether mercy received or mercy given. The separation between God and man, recalled by the story of the Tower of Babel, is reversed by the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost: in pride, man distanced himself from God and his fellow man, and communication broke down. Through the gift of tongues, the Holy Spirit reestablishes the lines of communication. In the Spirit, man reconciles not only with God but with his fellow man.

We ought to pray to and invoke the Holy Spirit, for each one of us greatly needs His protection and His help. The more a man is deficient in wisdom, weak in strength, borne down with trouble, prone to sin, so ought he the more to fly to Him who is the never-ceasing fount of light, strength, consolation, and holiness. And chiefly that first requisite of man, the forgiveness of sins, must be sought for from Him: "It is the special character of the Holy Ghost that He is the Gift of the Father and the Son."

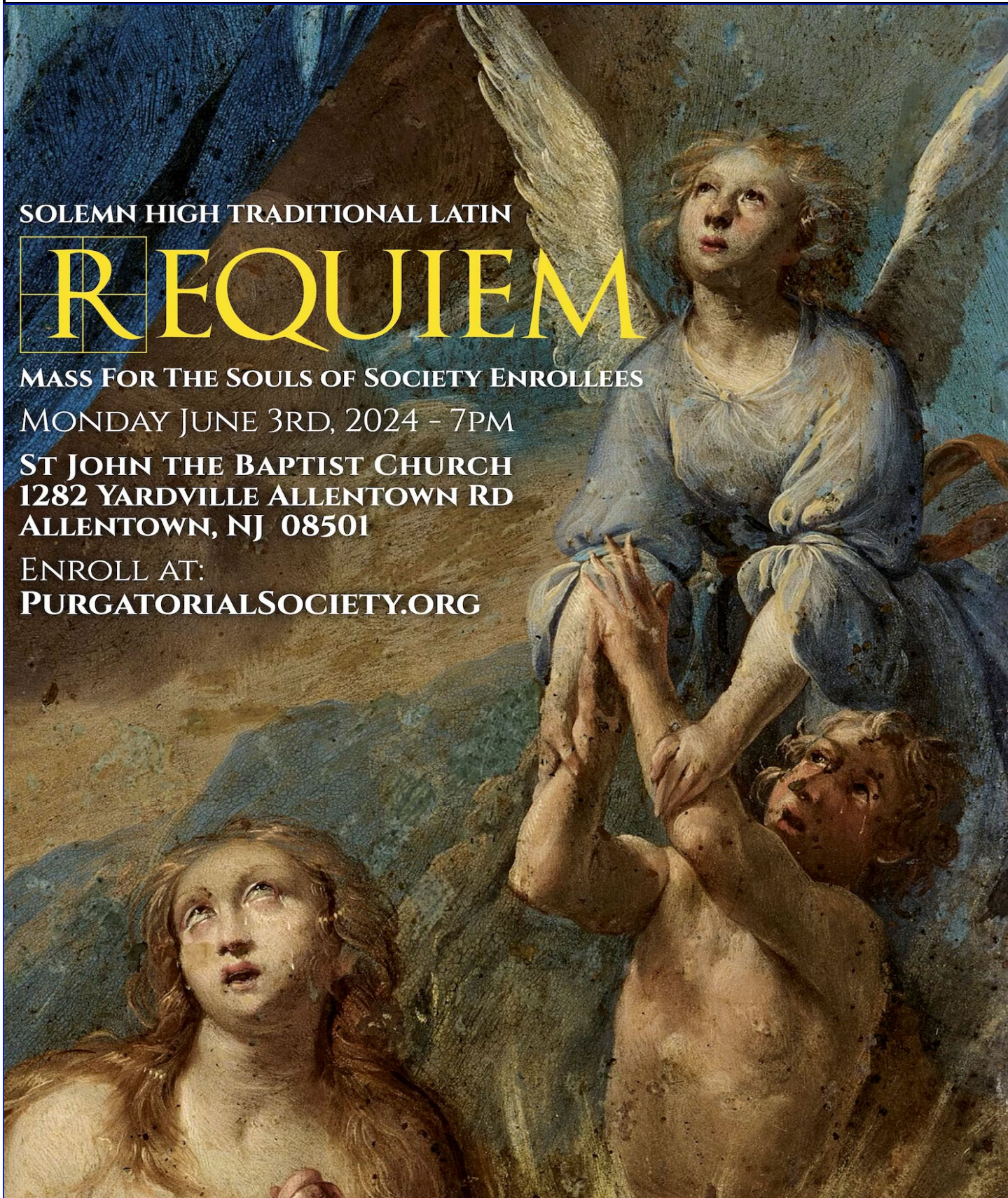

2024 Summer Ember Days

The Carmelite Corner

PENTECOST

READINGS:
ACTS 2:1-11
JN 14:23-31

Ÿ. Praised be Jesus Christ... R̄. Now and forever!

We Catholics think of Pentecost as a strictly Christian observance, but not so! Originally, Pentecost is a central feast of Judaism. Known as the Feast of Weeks, or שבועות [Shavuot] in Hebrew. Together, with פסח [Pesach = Passover] and סוכות [Sukkot = Feast of Tabernacles], it was one of the three pilgrimage feasts of Israel during which each adult male was required to be present in Jerusalem (cf. Ex 23:14-17). Imagine St. Joseph taking the Child Jesus to Jerusalem three times a year from Nazareth, by foot, some roughly 100 miles. "Pentecost" is the rendering of this word from the Greek [Πεντηκοστή], meaning "fifty," since Shavuot occurs fifty days after the first day of Passover.

We have a first Lesson of today from Acts of the Apostles, and the timing of our Pentecost is directly tied to Shavuot – this accounted for so many people, from all different nations, being in Jerusalem at the time. The Church of Jesus Christ receives its birth under the operation of the Holy Spirit – giving the strength of bold proclamation and clear understanding. The Church is under the guidance of the Holy Spirit – emboldening all Christians to proclaim a reliable message of salvation open to all the nations.

There is a wonderful tradition at the Church of Santa Maria Rotunda in Rome [formerly the Pantheon] on Pentecost, with this illustrated by a shower of rose petals from the oculus [the center hole in the roof to let in light]. Once a year, after the 10:30am Mass, petals fall from 144 feet (44 meters) above. The tradition of raining rose petals dates back to 609 A.D. under Pope Boniface IV, who dedicated this formerly pagan temple as a church in honor of the Virgin Mary and all martyrs. The falling petals symbolize the descent of the Holy Spirit at our first Catholic Pentecost.



O.H.M. Teresa of Ávila had numerous mystical experiences and wished to share this with her Carmelite sisters. These, she knew, were informed by the power of the Holy Spirit, upon Whom we must call to progress in prayer and relationship with God. She invited her sisters, as she invites us, to connect continuously with the Paraclete.

Veni, Sancte Spiritus! Come, Holy Spirit! To Jesus Christ be all glory, alleluia!
