A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel reading is striking. Whenever we read the Gospel it's important to imagine the vocal undertone of Christ's words. Like any other person, sometimes His voice would have been gentle and calm, and sometimes it would have been tense. And in today's Gospel Jesus proclaims: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." There's a vibrant urgency to these words that must have been apparent in His voice. What does He mean? Why is He so passionate about this?

In the ancient Jewish world, fire was generally associated with judgment. We usually associate judgment with punishment. Yet Christ himself said in the Gospel of John that He did not come to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. So what kind of judgment does Jesus bring? He brings the judgment of the Cross. He brings the judgment that God so loved the world that He gave His only Son for us. He brings the judgment that brought Saint Paul to exclaim that "He loved me and He gave Himself for me."

Jesus wants us to reciprocate the love our heavenly Father offers us and to follow the path of righteousness. Saint Teresa of Avila said that the Devil likes to incite us to think about the great things we might someday do for God, and to forget about the good we can actually do right now. And there's one thing that we can all do that seems very small, but it makes all the difference in the world. We can invite someone else to the Sacraments.

As Catholics, we believe that the Mass renews Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. Jesus loved each one of us, personally, and died for us. He has wanted to stay with us in the Eucharist until the end of time. We're never alone; God is near us. We also believe that Jesus wants to forgive our sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. No matter what we've done or failed to do, He wants to give us the tremendous joy of hearing the words: "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." If we really believe that, why not invite someone else to experience it too?

Most of us know someone who has fallen away from the Church. Why not tell them about our experience of Reconciliation, and invite them to go too? Or why not invite them to come to Mass some Sunday? The little things make the greatest difference. A tiny spark can set the world ablaze. Now we prepare to receive a small host transformed into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. God takes the little things and makes them into something unfathomably great – He wants us to share in that same power of His eternal love.



Ordinary Form Altar Server Opportunity

Altar Servers perform a unique ministry within the Church. Vatican II teaches us the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". Aside from a priest or deacon, no other member of the parish community helps with preparation or is as close to the Eucharistic Celebration as an Altar Server. As such, altar service is vital to the Liturgy, and a gift to those who serve our Lord.

On August 2, 2006, Pope Benedict XVI addressed a group of Altar Servers and offered the following thoughts about this ministry "Dear Altar Servers, you are, in fact, already apostles of Jesus! When you take part in the Liturgy, by carrying out your altar service, you offer a witness to all. Your absorption, the devotion that wells up from your heart and is expressed in gestures, in song, in the responses: if you do it correctly and not absent-mindedly, then in a certain way your witness is one that moves people."

Altar Serving has a rich history, and children have played a role of service dating back to the time of Jesus. In chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, Jesus feeds a crowd of 5,000. This was a true miracle in which we learn it was a boy who provided Jesus with the five loaves of bread and two fish that were used to feed the crowd.

Another example can be seen in the early Church when Christians in Rome celebrated Mass underground from fear of persecution. Those identified as Christian were placed in prison and condemned. It was unsafe for priests and adult Christians to bring Communion to these prisoners for risk of being caught. A young boy named Tarcisius pleaded with his Bishop to let him bring Communion to these prisoners, as he believed he would pass unnoticed. Tarcisius was ultimately permitted to do so and joyfully set out with the Blessed Sacrament pressed against his heart. Along the way some children asked him to join a game, but he declined. Tarcisius was soon identified as Christian, and martyred. Before he died, Tarcisius handed the Blessed Sacrament to a Christian soldier and asked him to carry God to the prisoners. This young boy became a Saint.

The opportunity to be part of this wonderful ministry for the Ordinary Form of the Mass is open to boys and girls who have received their first Holy Communion. In addition to this Sacramental requirement, Altar Servers must:

- * Have a strong desire to serve at the Altar with dignity and reverence
- * Be familiar with the Mass and able to participate in prayer and song
- * Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and embrace the teachings of the Catholic Church
- Be willing to attend practices as scheduled

Questions and Answers About the Traditional Latin Mass by Rev. H. Todd Carter

Why does the priest sprinkle water on the congregation before the Sunday High or Solemn High Traditional Latin Mass that is celebrated here at St. John the Baptist?

This action is called the **Asperges or the Rite of Sprinkling.** It is, strictly speaking, not part of the Mass but a preparation for the Mass. The word Asperges is from the Latin word meaning "to wash" or "to sprinkle." It is also the first word of the psalm which is said while the rite is prayed. In this rite, the celebrant of the Mass dips the aspergillum (the metal object with which he sprinkles) into the holy water and sprinkles the water on the altar, on all those who serve the Mass and then on the congregation.


This ceremony reminds us of our Baptism and calls the protection of God through His Holy Angel on all who are sprinkled. This rite takes place only on Sunday, before the principal Mass of the day.



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit reminds us that God, in His justice, will humble those who are proud. The humble before God simply trust in Him, casting their cares upon Him, and He will sustain them by His unfathomable mercy.

The Epistle finds the continuation of the first Letter to the church at Corinth. Paul speaks of their good fortune to no longer be heathens, worshipping "dumb idols," εἴδωλα τὰ ἄφωνα [eidōla ta aphōna], i.e., idols that were mute, incapable of communication or help – for they were just non-living images. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit, Who bestows all kinds of graces and gifts, but in all of these, there is only one Spirit in operation, providing it all. The Corinthians are reminded, in no uncertain terms that they are not to be congratulating themselves for their perceived spiritual excellence – they were given this as free gift. The Gospel continues this admonition against self-congratulations. The justice of God, by faith in Christ Jesus – there is no distinction, for all humanity ὑστεροῦνται τῆς δόξης τοῦ Θεοῦ [hysterountai tēs doxēs tou Theou = fallen short of the glory of God [cf. Rom 3:23]. The pharisee in this story presumably is praying; actually, he is comparing himself to others and congratulating himself for his spiritual 'excellence.' How much more Jesus values the prayer of a repentant sinner who dares not look heavenward. God justifies the humble, but He opposes the proud. Truly, who are we, when we are compared to the Almighty?

The virtue of humility is an essential component of Carmelite spirituality. Even a cursory survey of The Way of Perfection and The Book of Her Life of OHM Teresa of Ávila (not even to mention references in *The Interior Castle* and other works) reveals that she mentions humility more than one hundred times. Truly, it would be easier to enumerate Teresa's writings which do not mention humility—for none are to be found. Humility finds its etymology from the Latin, humus – this is soil, actually the droppings of a worm. This root finds its use in humor and human, as well. Compared to God, we are dirt, and, in fact, that is from which we were fashioned – Memento, homo quia pulvis es, et in pulverum reverteris – Remember, man, that thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return [cf. GEN 3:19]. However, humility is not think *less* of one's self, as much as it is thinking of one's self *less*. Teresa mentioned two important components of humility: walking in truth and self-knowledge. We aim to be like the publican who know what he truthfully was, for humility before the throne of grace is powerful, indeed. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"Remember that true humility consists in being ready for what the Lord wants to do with you and happy that he should do it, and in considering yourselves unworthy to be called his servants."






