A Note From Our Pastor

Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

The Church is reminding us of three things in today's Gospel passages: First, that heaven exists. This is the banquet in the Kingdom of God, the way that Jesus describes salvation and eternal life. Second, that hell exists. This is what's outside that banquet, where there is "wailing and grinding of teeth" - images of the hopeless frustration that the human soul experiences when it is cut off forever from friendship with God. And third, that in order to make our way to heaven, we have to keep on doing our part.

It is not enough to have a superficial knowledge of Christ - like the people who said, "We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets." Rather, we have to have a living, lasting, growing friendship with Christ. That is what we were created for, and that is what will lead us to true life. And since friendship always involves effort, self-sacrifice, and the investment of time and energy, the same thing goes for our friendship with Christ. Salvation comes from actually following Him, from striving to know Him better and live out His teaching and to say yes to the Grace He consistently offers us.

This is what Jesus means by "the narrow gate" that leads to salvation. To get through a narrow gate you have to leave behind all your excess baggage - you have to go through it on purpose. It is possible to be labeled a Christian on the outside without really making an effort to follow the Christian way in our hearts. It is possible to come to Mass, to be involved with parish activities, and still never really enter into a committed, life-changing, personal relationship with Christ. Jesus knows that going through the motions isn't enough; we need to let His Grace change our lives.



Is God Calling You to the Fullness of the Roman Catholic Church?

Ordinary Form Altar Server Opportunity

Altar Servers perform a unique ministry within the Church. Vatican II teaches us the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". Aside from a priest or deacon, no other member of the parish community helps with preparation or is as close to the Eucharistic Celebration as an Altar Server. As such, altar service is vital to the Liturgy, and a gift to those who serve our Lord.

On August 2, 2006, Pope Benedict XVI addressed a group of Altar Servers and offered the following thoughts about this ministry "Dear Altar Servers, you are, in fact, already apostles of Jesus! When you take part in the Liturgy, by carrying out your altar service, you offer a witness to all. Your absorption, the devotion that wells up from your heart and is expressed in gestures, in song, in the responses: if you do it correctly and not absent-mindedly, then in a certain way your witness is one that moves people."

Altar Serving has a rich history, and children have played a role of service dating back to the time of Jesus. In chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, Jesus feeds a crowd of 5,000. This was a true miracle in which we learn it was a boy who provided Jesus with the five loaves of bread and two fish that were used to feed the crowd.

Another example can be seen in the early Church when Christians in Rome celebrated Mass underground from fear of persecution. Those identified as Christian were placed in prison and condemned. It was unsafe for priests and adult Christians to bring Communion to these prisoners for risk of being caught. A young boy named Tarcisius pleaded with his Bishop to let him bring Communion to these prisoners, as he believed he would pass unnoticed. Tarcisius was ultimately permitted to do so and joyfully set out with the Blessed Sacrament pressed against his heart. Along the way some children asked him to join a game, but he declined. Tarcisius was soon identified as Christian, and martyred. Before he died, Tarcisius handed the Blessed Sacrament to a Christian soldier and asked him to carry God to the prisoners. This young boy became a Saint.

The opportunity to be part of this wonderful ministry for the Ordinary Form of the Mass is open to boys and girls who have received their first Holy Communion. In addition to this Sacramental requirement, Altar Servers must:

- * Have a strong desire to serve at the Altar with dignity and reverence
- * Be familiar with the Mass and able to participate in prayer and song
- * Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and embrace the teachings of the Catholic Church
- Be willing to attend practices as scheduled



READINGS: 1 COR 15:1-10 MK 7:31-37

THE ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST


V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Deus in loco sancto suo: Deus inhabitáre facit unánimes in domo: ipse dabit virtútem et fortitúdinem plebi suæ. God in His holy place: God, who makes men of one mind to dwell in a house: He shall give power and strength to His people. [Ps. 67:6,7,36]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit reminds us that God dwells in His holy place. In his might, He gathers His children – providing for them and providing strength for them. The Epistle provides strength through a resurrection account to the Church at Corinth, which was going through some turmoil of self-aggrandizement at the time. Paul is careful to recount that this fulfilled prophecy, and it is the power of God that raised Jesus from the dead. The emphasis is on God's greatness, not that of the Corinthians. The color and credibility of the account is the progressive appearances of Jesus to Peter [Mary Magdalen saw the risen Jesus first – but remember the audience – women were not considered credible witnesses], then all the Apostles, then to 500 [viz. a large number] at one time. Paul considers himself "born out of time" – he was a persecutor of Jesus and His Church [cf. ACTS 9:4, 22:7, 26:14] also, Jesus appeared to Paul after the Ascension.

The Gospel presents this power of God at work through the healing action of Jesus. The account gives details of Jesus going from Sidon to the Sea of Galilee through the "10 [coastal] cities." It is almost in passing; however, this is some 50 miles – nothing further is said about it; however, it is the kind of detail that gives greater color and credibility to the Gospel account. The exact location of the miracle is not clear. The word Mark uses is παρακαλοῦσιν [parakalousin = implore], with the nuance of "calling alongside of" – and one can see the root of "Paraclete" in play. Mark gives us the petition for the Holy Spirit of God to be at work. And yet, what gives greater color and credibility to the miracle is that Jesus doesn't simply speak a word for healing, or simply lay His hands on the poor fellow – there is a whole ritual, with six actions in total: the taking aside, putting hands in the ear, spitting, touching the tongue, looking heavenward/groaning, and a command to be healed. Jesus spitting – did He not have manners? Actually, saliva was thought to be of therapeutic value at that time and place. We are part of a very "human-contact" brand of healing, a kind that people would understand. And, as we see frequently in the Gospel of Mark, Jesus commands that no one be told of this wonder; but human beings, what they are, they pronounce the wonder all the louder. One gets the sense that Jesus was not ready for His glory, so He wanted to maintain somewhat of a low profile.

In *The Interior Castle* of OHM Teresa, she speaks of the power of God in the soul's journey to Him. She too, uses "contact" images, as the soul advanced in prayer cannot fully express this in words. For instance, she wants to convey the relationship of the soul to God in the prayer of the Fifth Mansions [of which there are seven]. The soul is sealed with His seal, she writes, and in this state it has very little to do except to indicate its willingness to receive the divine impress. "It does no more than the wax when a seal is impressed on it, and it does not even soften itself so as to be prepared..." May we journey to God by accepting His loving imprint.






