A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel recounts the arrival of Jesus and his disciples at the house of their friends Martha, Mary and Lazarus in Bethany. (On a later occasion, Jesus wept when he learned that Lazarus had died. He then brought him back to life). Bethany lies about two miles from Jerusalem. Jesus would stop there to rest in the home of his friends before going on up to the holy city. He felt at home in that place, surrounded as he was by joy and affection. This is how we ought to welcome Jesus, who is in the Tabernacle. We have no more faithful friend than He. He deserves our loving attention more than anyone else.

In this warm family environment the sisters behaved with naturalness and simplicity, even as they revealed different attitudes. Martha was distracted with much serving. She seems to have been the elder of the two – Saint Luke says, a woman named Martha received him into her house. She was completely taken up with the work of tending to the Lord and His disciples. Certainly, there would have been plenty to keep her occupied. To receive such a numerous group was no easy task, especially since they had arrived so unexpectedly. Understandably, Martha wants to welcome the Lord in an appropriate manner. We know that at a certain point she lost her composure and became frustrated due to her misreading of the situation.

Mary, on the other hand, sat at the Lord's feet and listened to His teaching. Martha was distracted by her task of preparing the meal. In her eagerness to get the meal ready for the Lord, Martha becomes preoccupied by a million little details. Her sister Mary prefers instead to devote herself to their guest. She forgets about her sister and sits before Him, doing nothing else but listen to His word. With the help of divine Grace, we have to learn how to live a unity of life, which consists of the union of Martha's and Mary's attitudes. Our love of God should be inseparable from our apostolic zeal, and our work be well done for the glory of God.



Nine-Day Novena to Saint Anne, the Mother of Our Blessed Mother Feast Day: Saturday, July 26, 2025

A novena is a nine-day period of prayer to obtain special graces, to implore special favors or to make special petitions. Our Annual Saint Anne Novena began on Thursday, July 17 and continues for nine days leading up to her feast day on Saturday, July 26. The Novena prayers are at all the Church entrances as well as in this bulletin. All are invited to participate in this beautiful devotion as we pray the

novena prayers at or after every Mass during this time. Please visit our newly placed statue of Saint Anne and our Blessed Mother, located in the Church elevator cove.

Ordinary Form Altar Server Opportunity

Altar Servers perform a unique ministry within the Church. Vatican II teaches us the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". Aside from a priest or deacon, no other member of the parish community helps with preparation or is as close to the Eucharistic Celebration as an Altar Server. As such, altar service is vital to the Liturgy, and a gift to those who serve our Lord.

On August 2, 2006, Pope Benedict XVI addressed a group of Altar Servers and offered the following thoughts about this ministry "Dear Altar Servers, you are, in fact, already apostles of Jesus! When you take part in the Liturgy, by carrying out your altar service, you offer a witness to all. Your absorption, the devotion that wells up from your heart and is expressed in gestures, in song, in the responses: if you do it correctly and not absent-mindedly, then in a certain way your witness is one that moves people."

Altar Serving has a rich history, and children have played a role of service dating back to the time of Jesus. In chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, Jesus feeds a crowd of 5,000. This was a true miracle in which we learn it was a boy who provided Jesus with the five loaves of bread and two fish that were used to feed the crowd.

Another example can be seen in the early Church when Christians in Rome celebrated Mass underground from fear of persecution. Those identified as Christian were placed in prison and condenned. It was unsafe for priests and adult Christians to bring Communion to these prisoners for risk of being caught. A young boy named Tarcisius pleaded with his Bishop to let him bring Communion to these prisoners, as he believed he would pass unnoticed. Tarcisius was ultimately permitted to do so and joyfully set out with the Blessed Sacrament pressed against his heart. Along the way some children asked him to join a game, but he declined. Tarcisius was soon identified as Christian, and martyred. Before he died, Tarcisius handed the Blessed Sacrament to a Christian soldier and asked him to carry God to the prisoners. This young boy became a Saint.

The opportunity to be part of this wonderful ministry for the Ordinary Form of the Mass is open to boys and girls who have received their first Holy Communion. In addition to this Sacramental requirement, Altar Servers must:

- * Have a strong desire to serve at the Altar with dignity and reverence
- * Be familiar with the Mass and able to participate in prayer and song M
- * Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and embrace the teachings of the Catholic Church
- * Be willing to attend practices as scheduled



READINGS: Rom 6:3-11 Mk 8:1-9

The Carmelite Corner

THE SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

 \dot{V} . Praised be Jesus Christ... \dot{R} . Now and forever!

Dóminus fortitúdo plebis
et protéctor salutárium Christi sui est:
salvum fac pópulum tuum, Dómine,
et b é nedic hereditáti tuae,
et rege eos usque in s <i>æculum</i>

The Lord is the strength of his people and protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, and rule them forever. PS. 27:8-9

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit sets the theme of our dependence on God – He can do for us that we cannot do for ourselves – namely, to preserve us unto life everlasting. "Everyone wants to go to Heaven, but no one wants to die." This conundrum is addressed in our Epistle of today. Paul assures us of a death in Christ right from our baptism. When the Christian life is viewed in this manner, then death becomes a far less frightening proposition, not like those who are without hope – "For we are saved by hope. But hope that is seen, is not hope. For what a man seeth, why doth he hope for? But if we hope for that which we see not, we wait for it with patience. [ROM 8:24-25]" 'Hope' is mentioned in the Bible some 232 times [mostly in the Psalms, as there are 150 of them]; thus, it ought to be a recurring theme in our lives. 'Hope' in Scripture means "a strong and confident expectation." Also, it is a theological virtue, thus, a gift from God. We do not 'earn' it; we can pray for it. Hope is the companion to Faith and Charity – these are all bound up together in the Christian life. The practice of the Cardinal virtues 'tills the soil,' so that we may receive even more of this precious gift. Let us be dead to sin, so as to be fully alive in Christ.

And the Gospel gives us hope in the superabundance of God. They have nothing to eat, and in the account of Mark [in Scripture, we need to remember that the truth is more important than the 'details'], we have seven loaves, and eventually a few fish. Jesus pronounces the blessing, and the food is distributed – did they stop and count everyone? Probably not. This is an approximation, in order to overwhelm us with the generosity of our Savior. Trust in hopeful confidence, and Our Lord will not disappoint! Prayer and penance are essential elements in the Carmelite vocation. And taking very seriously what our Lord says: "*enter into thy chamber, and having shut the door, pray to thy Father in secret: and thy Father who seeth in secret will repay thee.* [MT 6:6]" Since the Carmelite is constantly in hopeful prayer, most people cannot see when it is taking place – this is a discipline from many years of formation. So, watch out – you will never know when one is praying for you! Mostly, we pray for the salvation of souls and for priests, the channel of God's grace and mercy to the Church. Please pray with us!

To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

Hope, O my soul, hope. You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly, even though your impatience makes doubtful what is certain, and turns a very short time into a long one. Dream that the more you struggle, the more you prove the love that you bear your God, and the more you will rejoice one day with your Beloved, in a happiness and rapture that can never end.

Pray for us Saint Anne, Who have given life to the Immaculate Mother of God. O God, who granted Saint Anne the grace to become the mother of Her who gave birth to your only Son, grant that we, who keep her in remembrance, may obtain Her protection. Through Christ, our Lord. Amen.
