A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack



My Dear Parishioners,

In a culture where arrogant confidence in technology and science reigns supreme, it is good to be reminded of this. We are not God. We need God. We will always need God. Asking, seeking, and knocking didn't go out of style with the discovery of electricity. God wants us to admit and accept this need, to take seriously his invitation to ask, seek, and knock. If we do, we will give him more room to work in our lives.

Saint Pope John Paul II used to receive thousands of letters in which people asked him to pray for their needs, their families, and their problems. He kept a stack of paper with all these prayer requests in his kneeler. Throughout the day, during his frequent visits to the chapel, he would pray for as many of the intentions as he could. The rest he would entrust to the care of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a sign of spiritual maturity to approach God in prayer, persistently and confidently with all of our needs, material, emotional, and spiritual. If we aren't doing so regularly, both as individuals and as families, it probably means that we are drifting away from God. Today, he is inviting each of us to come back, to come closer, to keep asking, seeking, and knocking.



Ordinary Form Altar Server Opportunity

Altar Servers perform a unique ministry within the Church. Vatican II teaches us the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". Aside from a priest or deacon, no other member of the parish community helps with preparation or is as close to the Eucharistic Celebration as an Altar Server. As such, altar service is vital to the Liturgy, and a gift to those who serve our Lord.

On August 2, 2006, Pope Benedict XVI addressed a group of Altar Servers and offered the following thoughts about this ministry "Dear Altar Servers, you are, in fact, already apostles of Jesus! When you take part in the Liturgy, by carrying out your altar service, you offer a witness to all. Your absorption, the devotion that wells up from your heart and is expressed in gestures, in song, in the responses: if you do it correctly and not absent-mindedly, then in a certain way your witness is one that moves people."

Altar Serving has a rich history, and children have played a role of service dating back to the time of Jesus. In chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, Jesus feeds a crowd of 5,000. This was a true miracle in which we learn it was a boy who provided Jesus with the five loaves of bread and two fish that were used to feed the crowd.

Another example can be seen in the early Church when Christians in Rome celebrated Mass underground from fear of persecution. Those identified as Christian were placed in prison and condemned. It was unsafe for priests and adult Christians to bring Communion to these prisoners for risk of being caught. A young boy named Tarcisius pleaded with his Bishop to let him bring Communion to these prisoners, as he believed he would pass unnoticed. Tarcisius was ultimately permitted to do so and joyfully set out with the Blessed Sacrament pressed against his heart. Along the way some children asked him to join a game, but he declined. Tarcisius was soon identified as Christian, and martyred. Before he died, Tarcisius handed the Blessed Sacrament to a Christian soldier and asked him to carry God to the prisoners. This young boy became a Saint.

The opportunity to be part of this wonderful ministry for the Ordinary Form of the Mass is open to boys and girls who have received their first Holy Communion. In addition to this Sacramental requirement, Altar Servers must:

- * Have a strong desire to serve at the Altar with dignity and reverence
- * Be familiar with the Mass and able to participate in prayer and song
- * Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and embrace the teachings of the Catholic Church
- Be willing to attend practices as scheduled

The Carmelite Corner

READINGS: ROM 6:3-11 MK 8:1-9

THE SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Omnes gentes pláudite mánibus: iubiláte Deo in voce exultatiónis. Quóniam Dóminus excélsus terríbilis: Rex magnus super omnem terram O clap your hands, all ye nations: shout unto God with the voice of joy. For the Lord is high, terrible: a great king over all the earth. Ps. 46:2-3

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit sets the theme of rejoicing in God, great King, in voice and in action. The use of the word "terrible" is not to be misconstrued – terrible, in this sense means striking awe in those who recognize who and what He is.

Paul speaks to the Romans about proper vs. improper living, and there are layers of meaning. Remembering the first century context, Paul speaks of slavery. Slaves were sold from one master to another, and the slave would reflect on his former and new situations, past vs. present. Paul speaks frequently about sexual sin, but there is something more going on here. He also employs $\dot{\alpha}$ voµiα [anomia = lawlessness]; so, it is a whole gamut of unwholesome living. The old way is slavery to sin, with the effects of uncleanness and lawlessness, with the end result being eternal death. The new way is 'slavery' to righteousness, with the effects of holiness, with the end result being eternal life.

And the Gospel gives us a study in observing the 'fruits' of human behavior, comparing these to the realities of nature. Does one get grapes from such plants as "thorns, figs, or thistles?" Jesus relies on the common sense of His listeners. The 'plant' is the interior dispositions of the person – if one is a 'thorn' of a person – sharp, unpleasant by nature, should one expect that person to outwardly manifest good fruit? There are plenty of wolves in sheep's clothing to go around – we all have met them; and by their fruits we all know them. Not all who cry, "Lord, Lord" will be saved – utterly contradicting those people who speak of a "reasonable hope" that all are saved, or that I am "in" because I have accepted Jesus as my "personal savior." This takes little account of what Jesus actually says. Behavior matters – we cannot pay lip service and expect Jesus to assume all the accountability – bad fruit from poor interior disposition leads to eternal death.


Our Lady of Mount Carmel taught us the value of the scapular. A prayer offered while holding the Scapular is as perfect as a prayer can be. It is especially in time of temptation that we need the powerful intercession of God's Mother. The evil spirit is utterly powerless when the wearer of a scapular faces temptation, calling upon the Holy Virgin in this silent devotion. "If you had recommended yourself to me, you would not have run into such danger," was Our Lady's gentle reproach to Blessed Alan de la Roche, one of her devoted servants. Always wear yours!
