



My Dear Parishioners,

I pray that everyone had a peaceful and happy Fourth of July. We pray for our nation and especially those who assist by protecting our freedom, especially military, police, first responders and those in the medical field. May God protect and watch over them all. We pray for our nation that we can experience healing and peace and in gratitude for those who protect us. This weekend I ask you to consider saying a prayer as a family, for our nation that we may cherish and protect all those who help maintain freedom and the common good. May God Bless America, that we can cherish life in all its stages and protect the vulnerable, especially our Veterans who may be in need.

The words of Sacred Scripture are both informative – they give us information, and performative – they make God present. So it's important to listen attentively, and to try to pick up the significance of even apparently insignificant details.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus does something extremely important. When Christ sends His disciples out to share the new life they've discovered by being with Him, He sends them out two by two. No can become a saint in isolation. Therefore He sends them out two by two.

Summertime is Here: Soak Up the Son of God A message from Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. June 30, 2025

The Church just observed the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29, commemorating the martyrdom of the Apostles, St. Peter as Chief of the Apostles and St. Paul as the Apostle to the Nations. Each year, this solemnity is a national holiday in Rome and has traditionally marked the beginning of the summer vacation period for Vatican officials following a public Mass celebrated by the Holy Father in St. Peter's Basilica.

The observance of this solemn feast is an opportunity for all Catholics throughout the world to affirm our ancient Faith as we celebrate two of its greatest heroes and their entrance into eternity. Following the example of the Lord Jesus Christ, St. Peter and St. Paul gave their lives so that His Gospel might take root in our world through the spilling of their blood.

Despite the solemn, festive nature of this liturgical celebration in Rome and the days of vacation that follow, the martyrdom of Saints Peter and Paul are a reminder to all of us in the Church that summertime is not simply a holiday or a vacation from our Faith. In fact, the opportunities we have to take a break from the "rest of the year" work routines during the summer months, offer us a wonderful time to recommit ourselves peacefully, joyfully to the Faith that sustains us throughout the year — if we allow ourselves the occasions to do so.

Summer is a special time for family and friends by making time for them. No school! Picnics and barbecues; trips to the shore or mountains or wherever we enjoy some rest together; longer hours of daylight and starfilled nights; sitting outside, playing games, going to carnivals or summer concerts, taking long, leisurely walks or renewing healthy exercise to shed some winter pounds; gardening, picking strawberries or Jersey tomatoes and eating Jersey corn on the cob; doing lots of things or doing nothing in particular, summer is a time to slow down and realize how blessed we are by God, surrounded by those we love most who are truly gifts the Lord places in our lives.

Here is something for Catholics, young and old, to consider. Summer also and more importantly gives us an opportunity to pray without a lot of the usual distractions; to go to our parish church and celebrate God's presence as we kneel or sit before the Blessed Sacrament a little more often, maybe during the week; to read some good books – perhaps something spiritual – to help nourish and strengthen our souls; to engage in conversations we may not otherwise have time for; to tell stories, share memories and laugh with one another, something we may not do enough!

I have to believe that when God created the world and time and the seasons, he gave us summer as a "pause that refreshes," again if we allow ourselves the time to pause. It is part of nature to soothe our human nature and ready ourselves for the long, busy months that follow.

Don't neglect going to Sunday (or Saturday evening) Mass and receive Holy Communion in your own parish church or wherever you may be. The same for sacramental Confession. Encourage your children to do so as well. Take them to church! There is no such thing as a part-time or occasional Catholic.

This summer, spend some precious time, whether long or intermittent, to renew and refresh yourselves. You need it. It is a gift from God. Show your gratitude for this wonderful, amazing gift by using it with your families and friends, for your families and friends ... for yourselves and for them..

May God bless you this summer with fun, relaxation, safety, family, good friends and the true spiritual joys that renew your lives as Catholics, your spirit and your faith, hope and love. As you "soak up some sun," don't forget to soak up the Son of God as well!

The Carmelite Corner

THE FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

 \dot{V} . Praised be Jesus Christ... \dot{R} . Now and forever!

Dóminus inluminátio mea et salus mea, quem timébo? Dóminus defénsor vitae meae, a quo trepidábo? The Lord is my light and salvation, whom should I fear? The Lord is the protector of my life: Of whom shall I be afraid? PS. 26:1-2

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our Introit [entrance song] introduces us to a Liturgy that reminds us to maintain an unshakeable faith in the providence of God, and to heed His call in all our affairs. We are to live life with zeal and joy, knowing that God has all of this life firmly in His hands. The Epistle is from the first letter of Paul to the Romans – with its message that the sufferings of our current human condition are nothing compared to the glory we are to receive in Heaven. Every creature 'groaneth and travaileth in pain.' This promise of future glory, however, does not keep us from seeking to perform whatever good we can do within this life; quite the contrary, we abide peacefully with the sufferings of this age as we seek out and perform the will of God in the building of His kingdom.

Is there any one of us who cannot identify with the Gospel of today? How many times have we set about tasks under our own direction, only to have them end up in a smoldering heap? When we experience the miraculous, we quite naturally identify with Peter – we are all sinful, falling short of the glory of God. But that is just fine. Dependence on the Master will lead us to superabundant results and to the glory that we have been promised. We go one way [fishing for fish], and then the good God steers us in another direction [fishing for souls]. Prayer is the conduit by which we gain God's will for us.

Part of the Carmelite charism is to have utter dependence on God, and to the world this seems rather odd. 'Why aren't these people doing something?" Why do they hide behind walls [i.e., our nuns]? The life of a Carmelite is one continuous prayer – we are doing something! The world thinks that prayer and dependence on God are a waste of time, but there are too many incidents of the efficacy of prayer to think otherwise. Life itself is miraculous, as are all the favors we have received from the loving hand of the Good Shepherd. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"Lord, You see how often I fail, but I am never astonished at it... I enter into myself and say: 'Alas, I am at the first step as before!' But I say this in great peace, without sadness, because I know that You know perfectly how fragile is our nature and You are always ready to help us. What, then shall I fear? As soon as You see me fully convinced of my nothingness, You stretch out Your hand to me;; but if I should try to do something great, even under the pretext of zeal, You desert me. So, all I have to do is to humble myself, to bear with meekness my imperfections. Herein lies, for me, true holiness..."
