My Dear Parishioners,

Pope Saint Leo the Great once preached, "The Ascension of Christ is thus our own elevation, and the hope of the body is likewise called to where the glory of the head has preceded us. Let us therefore allow our joy to erupt as it should, and let us rejoice in such a fervent movement of grace: indeed, today we were not only confirmed in the attainment of paradise, but we also penetrated through to the highest heights of heaven with Christ; we received more from the ineffable grace of Christ than what we had lost through the jealousy of the Evil One. Indeed, the Son of God incorporated into himself those whom the virulent Enemy had crushed after a first period of happiness, in order to give them a place later at the right hand of the Father."

Let us pray for the joy to remember that the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord is a source of great hope, and may we experience the indwelling presence of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who is truly present among us.

And He Ascended Into Heaven

An excerpt from a Message by Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., on the Feast of the Ascension (Please visit Dioceseof Trenton.org for the complete text of the Bishop's Message)

Just as His Resurrection is our introduction to eternal life believing in Him, so too His Ascension is our path to eternal glory. The Ascension prepared the Church for the presence of His Holy Spirit, His promised Advocate, on Pentecost, ten days later.

With that in mind, St. Augustine explained: "For just as he remained with us even after his Ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him ... While in heaven he is also with us; and we, while on earth, are with him. He is here with us by his divinity, his power and his love. We cannot be in heaven, as he is on earth, but in him, we can be there by love ... Out of compassion for us he descended from heaven, and although he ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in him by grace" (Augustine, "Sermon on the Ascension of the Lord").

For us as Catholics and for all Christians, the Solemnity of the Ascension - whether celebrated on Thursday of the sixth week after Easter or the following Sunday - offers us hope that the heavenly Christ will return to us in glory, that His Holy Spirit will remain with us now and always as we proclaim His love and mercy and truth, and that, through our faith, we will be His witnesses "until the end of the age."



THE SUNDAY AFTER THE ASCENSION

V. Praised be Jesus Christ...

R. Now and forever!

Exáudi Dómine vocem meam qua clamávi ad te, vultum tuum, Dómine, requiram: ne advérstas fáciem tuam a me, allelúja, allelúja.

Hear, O Lord, my voice with which I cry to Thee, allelúia: tibi dixit cor meum, quæsivi bultum tuum; alleluia. My heart hath said to Thee: I have sought Thy face; Thy face, O Lord, I will seek: Turn not Thy face away from me, alleluia, alleluia. [Ps 26:7-9]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit [entrance song] of today changes in character. The unbridled joy of the songs prior to the Ascension give way to a more plaintive quality. Jesus is returned to the Father, and we seek our Lord's face. Our humanness "misses" Jesus, and yet, we are "alleluia" people, for we trust in His promises.

The Epistle of today from Peter, and it leads with the cardinal virtue of prudence. The highest good that humans can attain in this world is to operate on right reason. Temperance and fortitude are virtues within ourselves, and justice is the virtue of giving to others their due. But it is prudence that permits us to maintain and exercise right reason to know how to practice the other virtues. To live a virtuous life, we must practice charity towards all, and this might be even heroic in some cases. But it is essential in all our affairs. Our words and actions, in prudence and charity, must redound to the glory of God. Our Gospel of today steps us back a bit from the observance of the Ascension we have just had on Thursday. A great source of division exists between the great Churches of the West [Catholic] and the East [Orthodox], with the principal cause is the progression of the Spirit. The former holds that the Spirit proceeds from the "Father and the Son"; the latter holds that the Spirit proceeds but from the Father. When one looks at the original Greek of the text one sees in John 15:26 Τσαν ἔλθη ὁ Παράκλητος, ὃν ἐγὼ πέμψω ὑμῖν παρὰ τοῦ Πατρός = "When comes the Helper whom I will send to you from the Father." Jesus is the intermediary agent, from His own lips. One would consider the matter settled – it makes sense, as Jesus is part of the Trinity - co-equal and co-eternal.

The Carmelite develops a charitable heart and resolve for virtue by seeking the face of the living God by through "contemplation." OHM Teresa of Avila and OHF John of the Cross are great mystical doctors of the Church, and they have inspired the Order to seek and find the face of God in all affairs and in every possible place. Teresa advises, "Know that even when you are in the kitchen, our Lord moves amidst the pots and pans." Catholic lay Faithful are invited to this way of life and are encouraged to live this kind of daily life. Wear the brown Scapular of Our Lady! To Jesus Christ be all glory, alleluia!
