

A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, which is a great

reminder to us of the gift our Lord has given us in the Most Holy Eucharist. Christ's close presence, most evident in the Eucharist, gives us strength to fulfill our life's mission and discover the happiness He wishes for us.

We would do well to take a moment after Communion to recognize and reflect on this precious gift our Lord makes available to us every week. The time after Communion gives us the time to pray a prayer of thanksgiving. The Eucharist gives us the charity to live out in the world and remember that by receiving it we are in communion with our Lord, with the saints who enjoy God's presence in heaven and with all those who receive Him in the world. That is a basic belief that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist - His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity - and by receiving Holy Communion we become a part of the mystical body of Christ. It is such a shame that some choose not to believe this and see it only as a sign.

In this era when science is king, some are tempted to belittle the mysterious and miraculous aspects of our Christian faith. And yet, the mysteries and the miracles are still real. Just because God doesn't fit into a test tube doesn't mean God doesn't exist.

The Church is a wise mother. She keeps us humble. She reminds us that God is bigger than our limited human minds. Today she gives us one of the biggest of those reminders, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi.





The Sacred Heart of Jesus: The Treasure of Tenderness and Mercy

(Excerpts from his letter of June 7, 2024)

The heart as a symbol of love dates back to ancient times and the writings of philosophers. In the Middle Ages (12th to early 14th centuries), the heart appeared in popular artwork of the time, gradually finding a place in many religious representations associated with Christ. In the Renaissance period (late 14th to 17th centuries), depictions of references to the "Sacred Heart of Jesus" became commonplace.

Today, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most popular Catholic traditions. It is rooted in Christ's human incarnation as well as the fullness of his love for humankind. The "Heart" of Jesus - True God and True Man - represents his Divine and Human compassion and mercy.

In 1353, Pope Innocent VI created a Mass honoring the Sacred Heart. In 1670, the Feast of the Sacred Heart, with a Mass and Divine Office, was established in France by Father later St. John Eudes (1601-1680). Three years later, French Sister later St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) reported visions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to her superior shortly after Christmas, telling her that Jesus allowed her to rest her hand upon his beating heart.

In the course of these visions, Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary how his Sacred Heart should be honored with prayer, Eucharistic Adoration and reception of Holy Communion of the First Friday of each month. Additionally, acts of consecration, reparation for sin and devotion to the Sacred Heart were prescribed. The feast day, raised to the rank of Solemnity, is celebrated 19 Days after Pentecost, always on Friday. Representing Divine love for all humanity, the month of June is annually dedicated to the Sacred Heart. This year, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated on Friday, June 27.

Let us pray. Jesus, gentle and humble of heart.

Touch our hearts and make them like your own.

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who glory in the Heart of your beloved Son and recall the wonders of his love for us,

may be made worthy to receive an overflowing measure of grace from that fount of heavenly gifts. Amen.

The Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary

- (1) "I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life."
- (2) "I will establish peace in their homes."
- (3) "I will comfort them in all their afflictions."
- (4) "I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death."
- (5) "I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings."
- (6) "Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy."
- (7) "Lukewarm souls shall become fervent."



- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) "I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored."
- 10) "I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts."
- (11) "Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart."
- (12) "I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

The "Time After Pentecost" in the Traditional Roman Calendar and in the Traditional Latin Mass

The traditional Roman rite observes at this point of the calendar the "Time After Pentecost." Extending over almost half of the year, it is the great season of the Holy Spirit, the age between the first Whitsunday and the Last Judgment.

While Advent commemorates the world before the Incarnation, and the Christmas and Easter cycles recall Christ's earthly life, the Time after Pentecost corresponds to the age, broadly speaking, in which we currently live. The Preface of the Holy Trinity reminds us of the ongoing work of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in our lives, while the green vestments betoken our hope in God while we await the Second Coming.

Each Sunday of the Time after Pentecost equips us with the graces and lessons we need in order to remain faithful disciples in this post-apostolic age.

THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ...

R. Now and forever!

Factus est Dóminus protéctor meus, Et edúxit me in latitúdinem: Salvum me fecit, quóniam vóluit me. The Lord became my protector, and He brought me forth to a large place: He saved me, because He was well pleased with me. [Ps 17:2,3]

Our Introit [entrance song] directs us to know that God will protect us and protect us – with the understanding that our lives should be a pleasing offering to Him. Our Epistle from the first letter of St. John assures us that the world will offer hate to those who follow the difficult road of the Christian life, the reminder is that we are victors with Jesus Christ over sin and death – we simply have to follow Him and show this discipleship in our lives. Love is the binding force of life – and if there is hate, then the spiritual life is killed. And John is very pointed here: πας ο μιοῶν τὸν ἀδελφὸν αὐτοῦ ἀνθρωποκτόνος ἐστίν [pas ho misōn ton adelphon autou anthrōpoktonos estin = Everyone hating his brother is a murderer]. A murderer does not have eternal life abiding in them. We, who wish to attain and keep eternal life are to be people of action – in loving others as Jesus loved us.

Our Gospel of today is the parable of the wedding feast. It is an allegorical parable that Jesus uses to underscore the eternal wedding feast of heaven – between Christ [the Bridegroom] and the Church [His bride]. The Israelites were the first to be called into covenant with God; Jesus has come to ransom the many by His Blood – however, most rejected Him. They are the invited guests who came up with 'excuses' not to attend the feast. Excuses for not following the invitation of Christ to the heavenly feast would certainly be a righteous cause of condemnation by God. The slaves are those who work for the salvation of souls, and it is clear that all are welcome to join in the feast – as long as they do as the Bridegroom instructs. And Luke is pointed - ἀνάγκασον [anankason - compel (them)] – if necessary, the servants are to drag people into the feast – the Father's hall shall be filled! People shy away from suffering.

However, Teresa of Ávila and John of the Cross had a tremendous desire for suffering. They were able to transform suffering into the hallmark of their relationship with God: by desiring suffering and by understanding it, they were able to embrace it as proof of Divine Love, reinforcing their self-confidence and strength in relationship with the Master. The Carmelite knows the goal is union with God, and that to progress in the spiritual life toward God involves suffering; however, the reward is well worth the effort. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"The soul is now determined to take no other Bridegroom than our Lord,
but He disregards its desires for its speedy espousals,
wishing that these longings should become still more vehement and that this good,
which far excels all other benefits, should be purchased at some cost to itself.
And although for so great a gain all that we must endure is but a poor price to pay,
I assure you, daughters, that this pledge of what is in store for us
is needed to inspire us with courage to bear our crosses."
