





We are grateful to our Sacred Music Director Peter Carter, our Schola Cantorum, and our Choristers for today's beautiful Sacred Music! Beginning on Easter and throughout Paschaltide, the *Vidi Aquam* is chanted at the beginning of the Sunday, 12:30pm Traditional Latin Mass during the Sprinkling Rite, instead of the Asperges Me:

Vidi aquam egredientem de templo, a latere dextro, alleluia: et omnes, ad quos pervenit aqua ista, salvi facti sunt, et dicent, alleluia, alleluia.

I saw water flowing from the right side of the temple, alleluia; and all they to whom that water came were saved, and they shall say, alleluia, alleluia.

Questions and Answers on the Traditional Latin Mass by Rev. H. Todd Carter

Why don't the names of the Sundays at the Traditional Latin Mass always match the names of the Sundays of the other Parish Masses?

The Traditional Latin Mass follows the Traditional Liturgical Calendar, while the Parish Masses follow the newer Liturgical Calendar. While there are many similarities, there are some differences of which to be mindful. The Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter seasons all occur at the same time. However, many of the Sundays have different names, such as right now, during the Easter Season when the Traditional calendar names the Sundays after Easter as those "After Easter", while new calendar numbers the Sundays "Of Easter". Other differences may include different feast days for certain Saints or Masses of Our Lord or the Blessed Mother. The Saint John the Baptist Parish calendar that was offered to parishioners in January lists the feasts for both calendars for every day of the year.

THE THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Jubiláte Deo, omnis terra, alleluja: psalmum dícite nómini ejus, allelúja, date glóriam laudi ejus, allelúja, allelúja, allelúja. Shout with joy to God, all the earth, alleluia: sing ye a psalm to His Name, alleluia, Give glory to His praise alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. [Ps 65:1-2]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we experience a renewed energy of joy, a reminder of the glory of that first Easter morning. The Introit [opening song] from Psalm 65 sets the tone – a shout, a psalm, and a praise of His glory. We are human beings, subject to the culture around us; perhaps our enthusiasm has waned a bit – we are reminded that the Easter season is ongoing. So, let us recharge our batteries!

In the Epistle of today, Peter admonishes us not to give in to our baser nature, as these adversely affect our souls. We are all to speak the Good News of Jesus Christ in the world; we have plenty of metaphorical "Gentiles" out there who could see our good works and glorify our Heavenly Father – if we were accused of being Christians, would the accusers find enough evidence to convict us? We need courage, serving our neighbors, and boldly proclaiming our joy! The Gospel of today initially baffles some of the disciples, and it offers contrasts. They will not see Jesus, and then they will see Him. He is returning to the Father – so what does this mean? Is Jesus going somewhere, and then coming right back after checking in? We must remember that Jesus is fully divine – as God, He knows that time ultimately having no claim on eternal destiny. Our Lord will return soon enough, at the end of the world, which is, indeed, a minor consideration when considered against eternity. But the world will rejoice – the Gospel will give this to the world; what the disciples do not yet fully appreciate, their message will be the means of the world's joy. They will have sorrow at Our Lord's ascension; their eternal reward will be joy beyond the imagining of the human mind.

The Carmelite perspective is to always abide in the joy of the resurrection, irrespective as to what the circumstances of this life may hold for us. Our Holy Mother Teresa counsels that when we accept what happens to us and make the best of it, we are praising God. We see the finish line, and we keep our eyes on the prize. Submission of ourselves to the holy and adorable will of God is the surest way to Heaven. We stumble, we fall, as brown scapulars are not bullet-proof vests; however, we confess, amend, and press on to the voice of the Good Shepherd. To Jesus Christ be all glory, alleluia!

"O my soul, submit to the will of your God; it is best for you.

Serve Him and trust in His mercy;
when by penance you have won some little claim to pardon for your sins,
He will ease your pain. Do not try to rejoice until you have suffered.
But, O my true King and Lord, I am incapable even of this,
unless You sustain me by Your power and majesty.
