

My Dear Parishioners,

Jesus' words during the Last Supper are mysterious, but glorious. In this passage, He reveals one of the great secrets of Christian life. When we are baptized, God himself, the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, actually come into our souls and take up residence there. "We will come to him and make our dwelling with him," Jesus tells us.

Have you ever wondered why Jesus ascended back into heaven fifty days after His resurrection? Why didn't He stick around? Because He wanted to be closer to us; He wanted to be able to dwell deep within our hearts, beyond earthly limits. If Christ had not "gone to the Father," He would have remained limited by time and space, as He was during His earthly life. But since He now dwells body and soul in heaven, He can be present to each one of us at all times, through the Holy Spirit. Since the three Persons of the Trinity share the same nature, where one is, all three are. But for the sake of our understanding, the Church has long attributed God's presence within our soul especially to the Holy Spirit, the most hidden of the three Persons of the Trinity, whom we are preparing to welcome in the coming Solemnity of Pentecost.

If we let this great truth sink into our minds and hearts, it would revolutionize our lives. We were created to live in communion with God. The deepest desires of our hearts are to know him, to hear His voice, to love Him, to experience His love. And yet, ever since original sin, those deepest desires have been frustrated. We have been separated from communion with God, forced to look in all the wrong places for the peace and meaning that only God can give. This is why the world has been inundated with ugliness, crime, sorrow, and sin. But now, through Christ's sacrifice on Calvary, the possibility of communion with God has been returned to us.



Ember days are certain days of fasting for the special sanctification of the four seasons and for obtaining God's blessing on the clergy, for whose ordination the Ember Saturdays are set apart. The Propers of the Masses reflect the Season in which they occur and include additional Lessons before the Gospel. Ember Days fall on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the first Sunday in Lent, **after Pentecost Sunday**, during the third full week of September, and after the third Sunday of Advent.

The Carmelite Corner The Fifth Sunday After Easter

 \tilde{V} . Praised be Jesus Christ... \tilde{R} . Now and forever!

Vocem jucunditátis annunciáte, et audiátur. allelúja: annunciáte usque ad extrémum terrae: liberávit Dóminus pópulum suum: Allelúja, allelúja. Declare it with a voice of joy and make it known, alleluia: Declare it to the ends of the earth: The Lord hath delivered His people: Alleluia, alleluia. [Is 48:20]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Easter season is winding down, but Mass begins with an allusion to Isaiah, an Old Testament prefigurement of the glory of the triumph over death by Jesus. Once again, we rejoice with Ps. 65, announcing to the "ends of the earth" that Jesus is risen from the dead, smashing the power of sin over our lives.

The Epistle of today is a continuation of James. We are admonished not simply to abide in religious fervor, or simply to feel "good" about what Jesus has done for us. We are admonished to be Christians of action, and not only by word. It is likened to someone who has good health but poor memory - we enjoyed a good "look" at ourselves, but then forgot how we appear. If we are to have a good Christian "memory," we must put into practice all that the Master has directed us - we will lose what we have been "given" if we do not "give it away." So, let us follow this message to sacrifice for the good of others, for this leads to our cooperation in fulfilling the righteousness of God. The Gospel of today sees Jesus promising that the disciples would receive what they ask in His name - this points particularly to things that point to those things that would make their "joy [to] be full." Not necessarily for that new sports car, but that which has eternal value. All of His ministry, Jesus taught in parables and proverbs. He did this to challenge those who truly wished to be disciples - they needed to figure this stuff out. But now, John's Gospel shows that Jesus does not risk having His message lost - He speaks plainly, and the disciples realize it. Jesus prepares the disciples for His return to the Father; He is risen in His glorified body, firstfruits of a pledge of glory for us, and for all the Faithful.

The Carmelite devotes much attention to the Resurrection of the Lord, and to His impending Ascension. The daily encounter with the Risen Lord is a principal influence on our spirituality. This focus draws the Carmelite into a reciprocal love of the Risen One with ourselves. In the Eucharist on the day of Resurrection, we identify with the love and overwhelming joy of Mary Magdalene on that glorious morning.

To Jesus Christ be all glory, alleluia!

"From the moment I entered religious life, I considered God to be the goal and end of all my soul's thoughts and affections. At the beginning of my novitiate, during the hours consecrated to mental prayer, I spent my time learning to appreciate the Truth of this divine Being, more so by the light of faith than by the work of meditation and discourse. 

Program Options

In-Class Instruction

Our Parish offers in-class instruction for Grades 1, 2, 7, and 8 (the Sacrament preparation years) on Tuesdays according to the following schedule:

Our online program will be offered to students in Grades 1 and in Grades 3 through 8. The program is coordinated by MyCatholicFaithDelivered.com, which is the Faith and Life Series by Ignatius Press. The same material that is covered in our in-class program is presented in our online program.

Requirements


For new students, we require a copy of their Baptism certificate, as well as documentation of the last level of catechetical instruction completed from a former Parish (if applicable). A signed Parent Commitment Form will be obtained after the parent reviews the Parent Handbook. New students will not be placed in a class or accepted for the online program until these items are received by email at **SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com**. Returning students who have completed the online program for the 2024-2025 academic year must submit their certificate of completion.
