

A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

All Souls Day should have a twofold focus for each of us. First and foremost, this weekend's commemoration is a call to prayer for those who have died and are being purified in final preparation for their entrance into the Beatific Vision. Though God has no need of our prayers, it is His Divine Will that we participate in the distribution of His grace.

For that reason, He chooses to solicit our prayers and then answer them, making us active instruments of His purifying grace so needed by those in this world and in Purgatory. By praying for those in Purgatory, especially on All Souls Day, we are assured that God lavishes upon them all that they need for the complete purification of their souls. The Mass, and our participation in the Mass, is particularly powerful and is the ideal way to open the floodgates of mercy for our loved ones who have died and remain unperfected. Take this duty to pray for these "poor souls" seriously. Know that those souls are depending on your prayers, because God wants you to pray for them and lovingly share in their purification. Offer prayers fervently for those souls.

A second focus to have on All Souls Day is upon your own soul. This weekend's commemoration reminds us of the importance of our ongoing deepening conversion. We are all called to be saints. Ideally, our central focus in life is to become a living saint and not wait to be fully purified in Purgatory. Becoming a saint today requires not only a lot from us, it requires everything. Absolutely everything!

Becoming a saint here and now means that we diligently seek out every sinful attachment within our souls and annihilate them. It means we continuously seek God's mercy, confess our sins, receive forgiveness, and then change our lives completely. This is no small task!






November: The Month of the Holy Souls

We have arrived at the month of November, which is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Throughout November, Holy Mother Church asks us to offer sacrifices and prayers for the remission of debt incurred by those faithful departed souls whose sins were already forgiven. In order to assist these souls, we will remember the names of the deceased that are noted on the back of our All Souls Day envelope (sent to all parishioners, example of one pictured below) for the entire month of November. An All Souls envelope was also enclosed in the latest Parish mailing. Although no stipend is required for this act of charity, your sacrificial contribution would be gratefully accepted. Envelopes can be returned by mail or dropped off in the collection baskets at Church.

Our Church also offers an important opportunity to relieve the Holy Souls in Purgatory through fervent prayers for the deceased. By visiting a cemetery and praying every day from November 1 to November 8, one may also gain a plenary indulgence for the faithful departed. Here is helpful information on obtaining plenary indulgences for the Poor Souls:

SIX GENERAL RULES FOR OBTAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE

- 1. One must be in a state of grace at least when performing the indulgenced act
- 2. Sacramental Confession (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 3. Reception of Holy Communion (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 4. Prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be)
- 5. Complete detachment from sin (even venial sin)
- 6. Performance of the indulgenced act (usually a special good work with certain conditions, places or times)

INDULGENCED ACTS TO BE PERFORMED FOR A PLENARY INDULGENCE

From November 1 to November 8: Visit a cemetery and pray for the poor souls (1 per day, with the indulgence applied to a faithful departed)

November 2: Visit a Church or Oratory and recite one Our Father and the Creed

A partial indulgence can be obtained at any time by visiting a cemetery and praying for the Poor Souls.

THE TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

In voluntáte tua, Dómine, univérsa sunt pósita, et non est qui possit resístere voluntáti tuæ: tu enim fecísti ómnia, caelum et terram, et univérsa quæ caeli ámbitu continéntur, Dóminus universórum tu es.

All things are in Thy will, O LORD, and there is none that can resist Thy will: for Thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. [EST 13:9,10,11]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit [from Esther] gives us ample reminder of the sovereignty of God over all created things, and that we would be foolish, indeed, not to abide by His holy and adorable will – yes, we should seek it out and do it promptly.

In the Epistle, Paul underscores to the church at Ephesus that they are not in a conventional struggle; no, they are in a fight for their very souls against supernatural powers that promote evil. The 'armor' of God is what is needed to preserve ourselves in perfection. This whole armor consists of truth, justice, peace, and faith: lastly, the helmet of salvation [in Christ Jesus] and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Prepare for the onslaught of the devil by gaining virtue and reading scripture.

In the Gospel of today, we see the value and the quality of mercy. In the 27th chapter of her masterwork, The Way of Perfection, OHM Teresa of Ávila explains the Lord's prayer. In teaching us this prayer, *Jesus is quite clear that we will be forgiven our transgressions to the degree that we forgive one another.* This prayer could be exalting or quite damning, depending on our choices and behavior. Teresa pauses on the first word "our," reflecting:

O Son of God and my Lord! How is it that Thou canst give us so much with Thy first word? It is so wonderful that Thou shouldst descend to such a degree of humility as to join with us when we pray and make Thyself the Brother of creatures so miserable and lowly!

Miserable and lowly – that about captures it. OHM Teresa of Ávila, often wrote about the mercy of God; indeed, her concept of religious life was to form communities of compassion and mercy, and she is the archetype of the Discalced [shoeless] reform. Like the human heart, Carmel is a hidden yet vital part of Christ's Mystical Body. For "should love ever fail, apostles would no longer preach the Gospel and martyrs would refuse to shed their blood." Working in silence and solitude, a Carmelite strives for union with the Beloved, offering prayers and sacrifices for souls, especially for priests. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"I have often thought with wonder of the great goodness of God; and my soul has rejoiced in the contemplation of His great magnificence and mercy. May He be blessed for ever!

I had many friends to help me to fall; but as to rising again, I was so much left to myself, that I wonder how I was not always on the ground.

I praise God for His mercy; for it was He only Who stretched out His hand to me.

May He be blessed for ever!
