

A Note From Our Pastor

Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

At the end of the fourth Gospel, Saint John's Gospel, we are told that if everything Christ did during His brief earthly life were written down, the entire world would not contain the books. We can infer, therefore, that many-maybe even the majority - of Christ's miracles and encounters were not recorded in the New Testament. So why did Saint Luke include the account that we hear in this Sunday's Gospel? Clearly because of the lesson that Christ teaches us by it: the beauty of gratitude. The one leper who came back to thank Jesus is praised for this gratitude. We can almost hear the sadness in Christ's heart at the lack of gratitude in the other nine who were healed.

Why does Christ value gratitude so much? Is He vain? Is His self-esteem so weak that He gets depressed if we don't praise and thank Him? No. He values gratitude because gratitude is valuable - it's valuable for us, for the health of our souls. In the first place, gratitude keeps us grounded in the truth, which is key for our ongoing relationship with God. To be ungrateful to God is not only unjust, but it's also living an illusion. The simple fact is that everything we have is a gift from God: creation, life, talents, opportunities, hope in heaven, the grace that helps us persevere in doing what is right - these are all God's gifts. We don't create ourselves!

In the second place, gratitude is the perfect antidote to sin. Sin turns us in on our selves, like an ingrown toenail; gratitude opens us up to God and neighbor. It directly contradicts self-centeredness, self-indulgence, and self-absorption. It builds bridges, unites communities, and softens hearts. It counteracts depression and releases anxiety. Gratitude is one of the most beautiful flowers in the garden of virtue - what a pity that it's so rare! That's why it's so important to make an act of thanksgiving after each Mass and give thanks to God for the Grace He bestows on us because of our participation in the Holy Mass.







The Carmelite Corner

READINGS: 1 Cor 1:4-8 MT 9:1-8

THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Da pacem, Dómine, sustenéntiubus te, ut prophétæ tui fideles inveniántur: et exáudi preces servi tui et plebs tuæ Israël. Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful:

Hear the prayers of Thy servant and Thy people, Israel

Hear the prayers of Thy servant and Thy people, Israel. [ECC 36:18]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our Introit is from Ecclesiasticus, a cry for peace but that the message of the prophets may be true and aiding people to right relationship with God. In the Epistle of today, we see St. Paul gives a gracious greeting to the Church at Corinth, and they certainly was feeling pretty good about themselves – little did they know what they were going to get, a few chapters later, as Paul upbraids them for their spiritual smugness and self-satisfaction.

In the Gospel of Matthew today, Jesus returns "to His own city" – this is understood to be Capernaum, a town on the northwest side of the Sea of Galilee; He had adopted as somewhat of a "base of operations" early in His ministry. This "return" was after performing great signs of power in Gentile territory on the other side. Jesus also knows the Scribes for the hypocrisy that underlies all their gossiping complaints. It seems that He deliberately sets them up for a fall – if one is carrying on in a poor fashion, sometimes the best medicine is to let the individual rant, and then let them burn with shame when one proves one's point. So, which *is* easier? Jesus knew that signs and wonders had to be performed to gain the attention and the commitment of the people. No visible sign appears when the forgiveness of sins is declared – Jesus reserves the miracle for the last, to prove He is who He says He is – and the Jewish authorities are made to look rather foolish. They burn with embarrassment, unable to contravene the divine power that Jesus possesses.

In 1843, it was from the Carmel of Tours, France that our Lord brought healing from the French Revolution by communicating to Sister Marie of St. Peter OCD His desire that a special cultus of the Holy Face be given a place in the Church. Jesus told her that God the Father was greatly offended by sin, especially by the Holy Name of God being blasphemed, and the Holy Day of the Lord profaned. He promised that through devotion to the Holy Face, God's justice would be disarmed, and He would relent of punishment due to the people. The Golden Arrow is by our dear sister, and was very dear to another Carmelite sister, St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, the "Little Flower."


