My Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is World Mission Sunday and I'd like to share an excerpt from Bishop O'Connell's letter that is on the website for the Diocese of Trenton (Dioceseof Trenton.org):

"As we celebrate World Mission Sunday, we are reminded of our shared responsibility to proclaim the Gospel to all nations. This day is a powerful call to unite in prayer and solidarity, supporting the Church's missionary work worldwide. This year's theme, Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples resonates deeply, echoing the vision of Pope Leo XIV, whose own missionary journey in Peru exemplified the hope and renewal the Church brings to the most isolated communities. As he said, the Pontifical Mission Societies are "the primary means for awakening missionary responsibility among all the baptized." His example calls us to renew our commitment to the mission of the Church—both near and far.

Let us remember that the Catholic Church in the United States was once a mission territory, nurtured by the sacrifices of Catholics from Europe and beyond. Today, we are called to extend that same generosity to the Church's 1,124 mission territories, where priests, religious, and lay leaders work in areas of poverty and persecution to bring the Gospel to those in need."

I ask that you take a moment to view the video from Pope Leo XIV on Mission Sunday that is posted on our Parish website (StJohnRomanCatholic.org). Please note that we will have a Second Collection next weekend, October 25-26 for Mission Sunday, as this weekend we have our additional monthly collection envelope for the Parish Property and Casualty Insurance.







The Carmelite Corner

THE NINETEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Salus pópuli ego sum, dicit Dóminus: de quacúmque tribulatióne clamáverint ad me, exáudiam eos: et ero illórum Dominus in perpétuum. I am the salvation of the people, saith the Lord: in whatever tribulation, they shall cry to Me. I will hear them and be their Lord forever. [Ps: 77:1]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our Introit for today reminds us that God will save those who listen to, and call upon Him. Reading of Scripture is one of the surest ways of attending to the Master – St. Jerome assured us, many centuries ago, that "Ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ." Covenant with God entails knowing Him and loving Him as demonstrated by keeping His commands – our salvation depends on this.

In the Epistle of today, we see the transformative work of the grace of God in the lives of the Church at Ephesus. The theme of Mass continues, then, with the understanding that the "new man" must be put on under the operation of the Holy Spirit and our cooperation with Him. The Apostle cautions for us not to let resentments or negative feelings prevail in our lives, for this leads us away from what Jesus would have us be. Our Holy Mother, Teresa of Ávila tells us that the call to holiness is universal: mysticism is not essentially extraordinary but rather is the culmination of the ordinary development of the life of grace. And many are called. In this sense, Teresa was not extraordinary. However, her achieving of it was exceptional, requiring full exercise of the cardinal virtues - putting off our former, corrupted selves, and putting on the new person, the one who is created in justice and holiness of truth. In the Gospel of today, there is a kind of parable within a parable. The first is the invitation to a wedding feast. The second is showing up, but not properly dressed. The Jewish people were the invited guests, who rebuffed the invitation; the new guests are the Gentiles - The king is God - the son is Jesus Christ - the bride is His Church. As the 'king' of the parable, God is determined that He will not have an empty banquet hall - He calls all, but those who embrace Our Lord's loving invitation will be admitted to this prefigured everlasting feast of Heaven.

Carmelites heed the great commission is to "go and make disciples of all the nations," thus the life of the Carmelite is *vocation and mission*. It is also quite clear that we are to have the proper attire – the soul in a state of grace – otherwise, we risk being cast out into eternal darkness. In Carmel, we ceaselessly pray for the necessary graces that all may be one in Christ, and we spend ourselves in good works to achieve this end. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!


