

A Note From Our Pastor

Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

Once again we find that prayer is the theme of the Gospel of the day. Here Jesus prefaces the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector by insisting to His followers that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. Taking into account all of His teachings, Jesus spoke more often about the need for prayer than about any other matter apart from faith and charity. At the beginning of his Pontificate, Pope Saint John Paul II declared, "For me, prayer is the first priority. Prayer is the basic prerequisite to service of the Church and the world ... Every believer should always think of prayer as an essential and indispensable component of one's vocation. It is the 'opus divinum' which precedes and overshadows every work. We well know that faithfulness to prayer, or its neglect, is a test of the vitality of religious life, apostolate and Christian fidelity." (Angelus Address, 1979) Without prayer, we cannot hope to follow Christ in the middle of the world. We need prayer as much as we need food to eat and air to breathe.

One of the most fruitful ways of prayer is in Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, which we have every Monday from 12:00pm until Benediction at 6:45pm and on Wednesdays from 5:45pm until 6:45pm. It is literally spending time with our Lord in quiet prayer and it can not only deepen our relationship with Jesus but also provide peace and comfort in the soul. I would recommend spending at least a half hour of quiet prayer before our Lord. We could just meditate on the upcoming Sunday readings or even pray a Rosary, since it is respect life month and the month of Mary.



Healing the Wounds of Abortion: Rachel's Vineyard Weekend Retreat November 14-16, 2025

Whether you have undergone a surgical abortion or are suffering from the trauma of a chemical abortion, the psychological and spiritual wounds can be sharp, deep and crippling. 
November: The Month of the Holy Souls

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace, Amen.

We have arrived at the month of November, which is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Throughout November, Holy Mother Church asks us to offer sacrifices and prayers for the remission of debt incurred by those faithful departed souls whose sins were already forgiven. In order to assist these souls, we will remember the names of the deceased that are noted on the back of our All Souls Day envelope (sent to all parishioners, example of one pictured below) for the entire month of November. An All Souls envelope was also enclosed in the latest Parish mailing. Although no stipend is required for this act of charity, your sacrificial contribution would be gratefully accepted. Envelopes can be returned by mail or dropped off in the collection baskets at Church.

Our Church also offers an important opportunity to relieve the Holy Souls in Purgatory through fervent prayers for the deceased. By visiting a cemetery and praying every day from November 1 to November 8, one may also gain a plenary indulgence for the faithful departed. Here is helpful information on obtaining plenary indulgences for the Poor Souls:

SIX GENERAL RULES FOR OBTAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE

- 1. One must be in a state of grace at least when performing the indulgenced act
- 2. Sacramental Confession (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 3. Reception of Holy Communion (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 4. Prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be)
- 5. Complete detachment from sin (even venial sin)
- 6. Performance of the indulgenced act (usually a special good work with certain conditions, places or times)

INDULGENCED ACTS TO BE PERFORMED FOR A PLENARY INDULGENCE

From November 1 to November 8: Visit a cemetery and pray for the poor souls (1 per day, with the indulgence applied to a faithful departed)

November 2: Visit a Church or Oratory and recite one Our Father and the Creed

A partial indulgence can be obtained at any time by visiting a cemetery and praying for the Poor Souls.

Special Information About Today's Mass

The Feast of Our Lord Christ the King is celebrated today (on the last Sunday of October) in the Traditional Catholic calendar. This Feast was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI: "We institute the Feast of the Kingship of Our Lord Jesus Christ to be observed yearly throughout the whole world on the last Sunday of the month of October; the Sunday, that is, which immediately precedes the Feast of All Saints. We further ordain that the dedication of mankind to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which our predecessor of saintly memory, Pope Pius X, commanded to be renewed yearly, be made annually on that day."

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, THE KING

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Dignus est Agnus, qui occísus est, accípere virtútem, et divinitátem, et sapiéntiam, et fortitúdinem, et honórem. Ipsi est gloria et impérium in sæcula sæculórum.

The Lamb that was slain is worthy to receive power and divinity and wisdom, and strength, and honor. To Him be glory and empire for ever and ever. [APOC 5:12, 1:6]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, The Introit of today is from the Book of the Apocalypse – John's vision of the Lamb upon the throne – the song goes up, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain." The Carmelite uses every aspect of this life to prepare for the joining in the eternal praise of the Lamb. Our lives are to be one continual praise of His glory. In the Epistle to the Colossians, St. Paul takes flight into the glories of the kingship of Christ; worth contemplating, for all is created through and for Christ the King.

In the Gospel of today, Pilate asks Jesus if he is a king; Jesus answers the question with a question – is Pilate asking on his own, or has he heard others? Jesus longs to possess the hearts and minds of all people, yes, even Pilate – and in Carmelite spirituality, Jesus is the king of all truth. Sr. Carmela of the Holy Spirit OCD prays, "Grant that Your reign of Truth may be established in my mind, destroying all error, deceit, and illusion. Enlighten me by your divine Wisdom."

The Feast of Christ the King was officially instituted by Pope Pius XI, on December 11, during the Holy Year of 1925, in his Encyclical, *Quas Primas*. Intending to remind mankind that peace in the home and across national borders comes from total surrender to Jesus' Sacred Heart, Pope Pius XI proclaimed, "Men must look for the peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ" and accordingly, ordered a formal Act of Consecration of the human race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to be publicly recited annually on the Feast of Christ the King.

The soul's first preoccupation should be to procure the love of Christ the King with prayer, meditation, pious reading, and sacrifice. Nothing is done without the love of Jesus, and the grace of God will not be lacking to the soul who loves Him. When the soul loves Jesus, it gladly takes Him as king and master, renouncing goods of earth in favor of the goods of the new and everlasting Jerusalem.

To Jesus Christ, the worthy Lamb that was slain – the King over all – be all glory forever!

Blessed Jesus, grant me stillness of soul in Thee.

Let Thy mighty calmness reign in me.

Rule me, O thou King of gentleness, King of peace.

Give me control, control over my words, thoughts and actions.

From all irritability, want of meekness, want of gentleness, O dear Lord, deliver me.


By thine own deep patience give me patience, stillness of soul in Thee.
