

A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

October has been a month when we are urged to pray the Rosary. The Rosary encyclicals can be divided into two groups: 1883-1885 and 1891-1898. The first group established the Rosary as a public devotion. The first encyclical (1883) prescribed the public recitation of the Rosary and the Litany of Loreto in Catholic churches and chapels as a special observance "for the month of October of this year." Encouraged by the reception of the observance for 1883, the encyclicals for 1884 and 1885 directed that October devotions be continued. The Feast of the Most Holy Rosary was given a higher liturgical standing. The invocation "Queen of the Holy Rosary" was added to the Litany of Loreto. This encouragement of the public recitation of the Rosary in churches conferred a new status on the Rosary.

As response to these trying times, Pope Leo XIII followed the example of previous popes by proposing the Holy Rosary as a "weapon" which Saint Dominic, eight centuries earlier, had confided to the Church. It was through the Holy Rosary that Dominic had overcome the Albigensian heresy, whose adherents lived in the southwest of France (not far removed from Lourdes). And, it was the Rosary which was responsible for the victory of the Christian forces at the Battle of Lepanto against the forces of the Turks in 1571, and again at Temmeswar and Corfu in 1716. The Rosary would continue to be "balm for the wounds of society" as it had been in the time of Saint Dominic, and it would make possible the two great goals of Leo's papacythe renovation of Christian life and the reunion of Christendom.

The Rosary was presented both as a "school of faith" and a "school of charity." Meditation on the mysteries of salvation was to lead to conversion of heart and change of conduct. Contemplation of the mysteries was essentially a loving act of gratitude (1894), through which the heart was "filled with love . . . hope enlarged, and the desire increased for those things which Christ has prepared for such as have united themselves to Him in imitation of His example and in participation in His sufferings" (1891).

Attentive consideration of the "precious memorials" of our Redeemer led to "a heart on fire with gratitude to Him" (1892). The Rosary was an expression of faith in God, the future life, the forgiveness of sins, the mysteries of the August Trinity, the Incarnation of the Word, the Divine Maternity, and others" (1896).

Let us take this devotion very seriously and pray for the grace of discernment to follow our Lady of the Rosary to her most beloved Son Jesus Christ. Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us.

MOUNT CARMEL GUILD FOOD DRIVE will be November 8 & 9. See the flyer in this bulletin.



THE EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY OF MOST HOLY ROSARY OF THE BVM

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Gaudeámus ómnes in Dómino diem festum celebrántes sub honóre beátæ MariæVirginis: de cujus solemnitáte gaudent Ángeli, et colláudant Fílium Dei.

Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a feast in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary: on whose solemnity the angels rejoice And join in the praising of God's Son. [c.f. PS 44:2]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today, we take a pause from the Sundays after Pentecost [XVIII] to have this joyful celebration – indeed, the entire month of October is devoted to the Most Holy Rosary. When a solemnity falls outside of a Sunday, it may be transferred to the nearer Sunday, as we see today, permitting all to participate in the wonderful feast.

St. Dominic de Guzmán OP received the inspiration for the Holy Rosary, which has been in use since the early 13th century. However, this feast-day sees its roots from the Battle of Lepanto. The Muslim Ottoman Empire had been expanding into Europe for 900 years, and by 1453, Christian Byzantium was under Islamic law. Westward movement continued into the Mediterranean, even threatening Rome. In 1570, Pope Pius V called for prayer and action. He pleaded with every man, woman, and child to pray the Rosary. He also put together the Holy League--a coalition of Catholic powers which included Genoa, Spain, and the Papal States. The very survival of Christianity hung in the balance. In 1571, the forces converged at Lepanto, at a narrow inlet of water in modern-day southern Greece. The Turkish fleet outnumbered that of the Holy League by an estimate of 10-to-1. Through Our Lady's intercession, the Turks were routed. Pope Pius V founded the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, to be observed on October 7, the day when he heard the good news. His successor, Pope Gregory XIII, changed the name of the Feast of Our Lady of Victory to the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary, explicitly acknowledging the intercessory power of the Rosary, especially in dire times.

The Carmelite has a daily commitment to the Rosary [ours have 6 decades, instead of the usual 5 – with an extra mystery added]. Our nuns wear this as part of their habit, and St. Thérèse, whose feast-day we have just celebrated, was no exception. And like us, she sometimes had a struggle with it – so, take heart! May "The Little Flower" intercede for us to gain greater devotion to Our Lady's Rosary.

Laus Deo Virginique Matri! [Praise God and His Virgin Mother!]

"... in vain do I strive to meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary; I am unable to fix my attention.

For a long time, I was sad because of this lack of devotion which surprised me, for I love the

Blessed Virgin so much that it should be easy for me to say, in her honor,


prayers which please her so much. Now, it saddens me less; I think that the Queen of Heaven,
