A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

This week we celebrate Palm Sunday and we reflect on the beauty of this moment. The people finally acknowledged Jesus as their King. In his book, *Meditations for Lent*, Jaques-Benigne Bosuett writes,

"Here everything was done by the movement of the people's hearts alone. No outward splendor struck the eye. This poor, meek King sat upon a donkey, a lowly, peaceful steed. There was no horse whose spiritedness would attract regard. There were neither followers nor guards, neither spoils of victory nor captive kings. The palms carried before him were the mark of another sort of victory. All of the apparatus of an ordinary triumph was banished from this one.

In its place, we see the sick whom He had cured and the dead He had brought back to life. The person of the King and the memory of His miracles were what made the feast. All that art and flattery can design to honor a conqueror in a day of victory gave way before the simplicity and the truth that made their appearance here. With this holy festivity, they led the Savior to the middle of Jerusalem, to the holy mountain of the Temple. There He appeared as its lord and master, as the son of the royal house, the Son of the God who was worshipped there. Neither Solomon, its founder, nor the high priests who officiated there had ever received equal honors."

This sets the tone of Holy Week for us, as Jesus Christ our King enters Jerusalem, He rides on a donkey and takes a cross for His throne. Pope Francis once said, "The throne of Jesus Christ is the cross upon which He gave His life for the world, and those who wish to follow Him must be prepared to sacrifice everything."

LENTEN REGULATIONS for Baptized Catholics in the United States

Good Friday is a day of obligatory FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat). No dispensation is granted on this solemn day except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).



The Carmelite Corner

READINGS: Phil 2: 5-11 MT 26:36-75; 27:1-66

THE SECOND SUNDAY OF OUR LORD'S PASSION - PALM SUNDAY

 \dot{V} . Praised be Jesus Christ...

R. Now and forever!

Hosánna Fílio David: benedíctus qui venit in Nómine Dómini. O Rex Israël: Hosánna in excélsis. Hosanna to the son of David: blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. O King of Israel, Hosanna in the highest. [MT 21: 9]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today is the second Sunday of Our Lord's Passion. How fickle humankind is! Yet, how tenderly does Our Lord love us, even to death. The waving of palms and the garments on His way mark the grand entry, and in a scant several days will he suffer the worst brand of humiliation, physical suffering, abandonment by friends, and a death in agony. How far have we gone from the high triumph of the entry into Jerusalem to the events of Our Lord's passion. The reading from the letter to the Philippians speaks about the κένωσις [kenosis = "emptying"] of the glory which was His. Not only descending to earth, but to die a wretched death in agony. St. Elizabeth of the Trinity OCD speaks of this "double abyss" – first, the condescension of Jesus from His throne in glory to be one of us, and second, to die the death of a common criminal – an abyss of wretchedness in human terms, let alone in terms of the divine. The Passion according to St. Matthew stands on its own merit. The story as to how wretched human beings can be is on full display.

The Carmelite begs the Master to change minds and hearts – our nuns have taken seriously St. Paul's call to complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the Church [cf. COL 1: 24]. Carmelite nuns keep a complete and prayerful silence during the Holy Triduum, not speaking until the conclusion of the evening Easter Vigil Mass. For more than a month, nuns have been sleeping on the floor, taking but one sparse meal a day. Women, unknown by the world, have laid down their entire lives to glorify God and to beg forgiveness for a shameful world. The Carmelite Secular Order members do not have the benefit of stone walls. They live in the world as ambassadors for Christ, dealing with all kinds of perversions that the world passes off as some kind of "good." The prayer and penance done is for conversion of the whole world, and for the salvation of souls. May this week be truly holy – may we all pour our hearts and souls into the contemplation of Christ Crucified. We weep for Our Lord and Our Lady who had to endure this suffering – may the Lord hand us the chalice of suffering, and may He grant us the grace to drink it all.

To quote St. Edith Stein OCD, "Ave Crux, spes unica!" - "Hail, Thou Cross, our one hope!"

"One Sunday, looking at a picture of Our Lord on the Cross, I was struck by the blood flowing from one of the divine hands. I felt great sorrow when thinking this blood was falling to the ground unnoticed. I was resolved to remain in spirit at the foot of the Cross and to receive the divine dew. I understood I was then to pour it out upon souls. The cry of Jesus on the Cross sounded continually in my heart: "I thirst!" These words ignited within me an unknown and very living fire. I wanted to give my Beloved to drink, and I felt myself consumed with a thirst for souls. As yet, it was not the souls of priests that attracted me, but those of great sinners; I burned with the desire to snatch them from the eternal flames."

MATINS AND LAUDS OF HOLY THURSDAY

HOLY WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16, 2025 7:00PM IN THE CHURCH

Tenebrae means "darkness" or "shadows", and it refers to the chanting of Matins/Lauds of the Divine Office on the days leading up to Easter Sunday. In the earliest centuries, this was chanted shortly after midnight, but starting in the middle ages, it became the practice to offer Tenebrae on the evening before in anticipation, to make it more widely accessible to both clergy and laity.

Following this tradition, we will chant the Matins/Lauds of Holy Thursday on Wednesday, April 16 beginning at 7:00pm. The Schola will sit in the front, and will alternate the chanting the verses of the psalms. The clergy attend "in choir" in the sanctuary, and will chant the lessons that separate the psalms. There is a candle "hearse" at the front, shaped like a triangle, with 15 candles. As each psalm is completed, 1 candle is extinguished, until only the lone candle at the top is left: this is a powerful reminder of the Apostles abandoning Christ in His darkest hour. The "Christus Factus est" chant is sung at the end, while the candle representing Christ is hidden. A "loud noise or commotion" (the strepitus) is then made, representing the convulsion of nature following the death of Christ: the chaos of the world without a Savior. The "Christ candle" is returned to view again, then all commotion ceases. All are invited to this beautiful and *(Overview by K. Walters/Mater Dei)*
