



A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

Large crowds were now following Jesus as He moved on towards His fate in Jerusalem. In order to teach them the full meaning of discipleship, Jesus spoke quite boldly: "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife, and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, he cannot be my disciple." (Lk 14:26). The thought of hating one's family and one's own life might appear to be at odds with Jesus' all-embracing command to love. But Jesus was using a form of exaggeration that was common in Semitic preaching. "hate" in this sense means to prefer less, not to despise outright.

Because Jesus talked like this to stress a point, we take His point very seriously: true disciples must renounce anyone or anything that stands in the way of a thorough commitment to Jesus. Our Lord used two examples to illustrate the mature deliberation and unswerving commitment that discipleship calls for. A wise builder would not begin a project without the necessary resources to complete it. Similarly, only a foolish king would send his soldiers into battle unless he was prepared, without hesitation, to commit himself fully to the demands of such an undertaking.

These examples illustrate how important it is that Jesus' followers establish their priorities properly. Saying that discipleship to Jesus is a priority, while remaining encumbered by other competing concerns or relationships, is practicing a false – and ultimately useless discipleship. As Jesus' disciples, we can ask the Holy Spirit to teach us how to order and prioritize our lives so that the demands of the Gospel do not conflict with the concerns of our family and our own wellbeing.

The Father has given us the Kingdom, His own life and nature. The more we learn to order our lives according to His nature in us, the more stable and balanced our lives will become. Tensions between the call of the Gospel and our practical responsibilities may arise, but God allows them in order to teach us to rely more deeply on His wisdom and leave our own ways behind.



Ordinary Form Altar Server Opportunity

Altar Servers perform a unique ministry within the Church. Vatican II teaches us the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". Aside from a priest or deacon, no other member of the parish community helps with preparation or is as close to the Eucharistic Celebration as an Altar Server. As such, altar service is vital to the Liturgy, and a gift to those who serve our Lord.

On August 2, 2006, Pope Benedict XVI addressed a group of Altar Servers and offered the following thoughts about this ministry "Dear Altar Servers, you are, in fact, already apostles of Jesus! When you take part in the Liturgy, by carrying out your altar service, you offer a witness to all. Your absorption, the devotion that wells up from your heart and is expressed in gestures, in song, in the responses: if you do it correctly and not absent-mindedly, then in a certain way your witness is one that moves people."

Altar Serving has a rich history, and children have played a role of service dating back to the time of Jesus. In chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, Jesus feeds a crowd of 5,000. This was a true miracle in which we learn it was a boy who provided Jesus with the five loaves of bread and two fish that were used to feed the crowd.

The opportunity to be part of this wonderful ministry for the Ordinary Form of the Mass is open to boys and girls who have received their first Holy Communion. In addition to this Sacramental requirement, Altar Servers must:

- * Have a strong desire to serve at the Altar with dignity and reverence
- * Be familiar with the Mass and able to participate in prayer and song
- * Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and embrace the teachings of the Catholic Church
- * Be willing to attend practices as scheduled

The Carmelite Corner

READINGS: GAL 3:16-22 LK 17:11-19

THE THIRTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Réspice, Dómine, in tesaméntum tuum et ánimas páuperum tuórum ne derelínquas in finem: exsúrge, Dómine, et iúdica causam tuam: et ne obliviscáris voces quæréntium te. Have regard, O Lord, to thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, And forget not the voices that seek Thee. [Ps 73:20,19,23]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit is a fervent plea for God to remember His people for the sake of both His mercy and His justice. God has made promises to His people and our most fervent hope is that He will deliver on His promises. It is not so much that God needs to hear from us in this regard; when we sing of this, we are reminded of His fidelity and His generosity to all of His children.

The theme of promises fulfilled is taken up in the Epistle of Paul to the Galatians. Jesus is portrayed as the seed of Abraham, and the fulfillment of God's promise to His people. The Jewish people were in exile for 430 years, and yet, God sees them through to the promised land. Paul draws the parallel of Israel's liberation to the liberation from sin that comes to us from Jesus Christ. Paul is also drawing the distinction between the covenant with Abraham and the law of Moses – the covenant with God came first, and no law can break this relationship with God's people. The law is the outcome of the Promise, to constrain and guide the people.

The Gospel of today presents us with 10 lepers, all who are hopeful that Jesus could heal them of their awful malady. Luke's account is not found in the other Gospels, and he introduces this as part of the journey of Jesus to his death and glorification being somewhere between Galilee and Samaria, further south, still a ways off from Jerusalem. We note that Jesus no longer uses a formal declaration of healing; he tells them to "Go, show yourselves to the priests." Jesus has nothing against revealing His power to the authorities now that the end of His mission is near. The salient point here is that of gratitude, or, more correctly, the lack of it. They all required faith in Jesus for healing, and they were all cleansed. There was only one who showed gratitude to Jesus for the healing, and that was a Samaritan. Jews and Samaritans did not get along, each considering the other ritually 'unclean.' This story prefigures the healing and saving message for all of humanity. Luke, as St. Paul would also do, would leave the unbelieving Jewish people behind in favor of preaching to the Gentiles, made worthy by the reception of the message.

The Carmelite reflects on this healing as being "sacramental" – the lepers being healed was an outward sign of the love of God for his children. The appropriate response to the bounty of God is that of profoundest gratitude, just like our friend, the doubly outcast leprous Samaritan, because God's love heals everything. To Jesus Christ and to His virgin mother be all glory forever!

"Oh, why can we not realize that sin is a pitched battle fought against God with all our sense and the faculties of the soul? The stronger the soul is, the more ways it invents to betray its King!"






